

The meeting was held through ZOOM.

Matt Sporleder, Bob Willhite, and Dave Lane were present.

First on the agenda was the second reading of the Jennings County Employee Policies and Procedures Manual Amendment. The amendment pertained to Section 4(L) Family Medical Leave, Paragraph (E) Employee Status and Benefits During Leave. Bob Willhite made a motion to accept the amendment. Dave Lane seconded. Unanimous.

Next, Nicci Lucas presented the information from Shepherd Insurance on the cyber insurance renewal. The rates have increased from last year based on projected revenue. The cyber report for our county showed a lack of coverage in two areas. Jennings scored a 50% on ransomware and cyber extortion and a 0% in hacking, malware, unauthorized access. The Commissioners want to research this further and speak with Eagle Point Technology, our IT provider. Bob Willhite made a motion to table the decision until the next meeting. Dave Lane seconded. Unanimous.

Nicci also spoke on the department head meeting that was had in regards to reopening to the public. Department heads gave their thoughts on a long term solution and many have plans in place. The Jail will be providing a jailer at the Government Annex building to take temperatures of employees as well as the public and monitor who comes in and out. The Commissioners want to keep on track with Governor Holcomb's plan. With that in mind, Bob Willhite made a motion to reopen the Government to the public May 26, 2020. Dave Lane seconded. Unanimous.

Melissa Wiesehan 4H Youth Development Educator with Purdue Extension spoke on the Virtual 4H program. She wanted to let the public know that 4H is alive and well. Normal events will be held virtually and judging will still take place. The 4H does rely on funding from the County and will provide educational opportunities within the county.

Jim Reeves, Highway Department, requested permission to advertise bids for liquid asphalt. The notice allows bidders to turn in sealed bids until 4:00PM on Thursday, June 4, 2020. Bob Willhite motioned to allow Jim to advertise. Dave Lane seconded. Unanimous. Jim also gave the Commissioners an update on his funds and will be keeping an eye on them in the upcoming months.

Sherri Maschino, Highway Department, spoke on a request from Annalee Alexander. Annalee wants to use the community building for a latch key program for her daycare. Currently 40 kids are signed up. This will run Monday through Friday 5AM-5:30-PM. Bob Willhite made a motion to table the decision until the next meeting. Dave Lane seconded. Unanimous.

Auditor Salsman presented the Commissioners with a contract from WTH to allow Corelogic to receive data from GIS. Once WTH receives payment from Corelogic, WTH will send data to Corelogic and a check for \$250.00 to the county. Bob Willhite made a motion to allow WTH to send data to Corelogic. Dave Lane seconded. Unanimous.

Dan Brookbank, Veterans Service Officer, spoke to the commissioner about the veterans van. Dan took the van out to the highway department to have it looked over. There were many issues that came back. County attorney Ellie Bright suggested posting the van for sale and taking sealed bids

Bob Willhite made a motion to approve minutes from April 14 and April 23's meetings. Dave Lane seconded. Unanimous.

Recorder Mary Kilgore made a request to use the Commissioners meeting room on June 9 from 11-1. Mary stated she will be using social distancing. Bob Willhite made a motion to allow Mary to use the room. Dave Lane seconded. Unanimous.

Bob Willhite made a motion to adjourn. Dave Lane seconded. Unanimous.
